Wednesday May 13,

Another movement of birds into the Park. New migrants, especially warblers have been located in a variety of places in the Park.

At the tip, an **AMERICAN PIPIT** was flying about and actually landed in a tree for a while.

Also noted at the Tip, **NORTHERN PARULA, ORANGE-CROWNED AND WILSON'S WARBLERS.**

Along the West Beach, north of the Tip, a couple of **CLAY-COLORED SPARROWS** were noted, as well as a **YELLOW-BREASTED CHAT.**

The place to be for warbler hunting was Tilden Woods. **KENTUCKY, CERULEAN, BAY-BREASTED, HOODED** and a host of others were reported. Also noted were Scarlet Tanager, Indigo Bunting, and many orioles, among other species.

I have heard few reports from the Woodland Nature trail but know that at least one **CANADA WARBLER** was seen there. Down the Post Woods Seasonal Trail a pair of **RED-HEADED WOODPECKERS** were seen.

Just in, a **MOURNING WARBLER** was located at Sleepy Hollow.

At least one **SUMMER TANAGER** was located this morning at the Sanctuary Picnic area (park at Northwest Beach)
